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
Foreword

The entryways opening into a world apart space and volume of the temple are as important as the internal spaces. Carved out of solid teakwood and silver gold inlays, the peacock motifs, floral patterns create welcoming enties to the rather imposing door sizes.

The panel construction fixed into stiles and rails is just the historic technique carried forward comprising of heavy wooden sections weighing nearly half a ton with assembly.

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ALTAR DESIGNS

The design of the Main Altars is based on the study of motifs related to the deities. The idea behind the elements located on the altars are related to their respective deities. These elements include Mridang, Kartal and Lotus Feet Chaitanya Mahaprabhu. Elements such as the Flute, Sudarshan Chakra and the Crown of Radharani are also used. A brief research of these aspects and their philosophies was done before designing of these elements.




