
A WORD FROM THE HEAD ARCHITECTS




UTILITY BLOCK






PROGRESS ON SITE








Tier Doors and Windows

The major change in design for the window came with the change in drawing from the frame dimensions. It is now in its way of completion.







Main Dome Tier

Side Dome Tier








Utility Block Design-Concept


